

For Academic Year 2012-2013: Factors Weighed for Admission to Magnetic Resonance Imaging Program

Admission to this program is competitive based on points being awarded for grades in various courses and/or scores on tests. The following factors are considered in determining which candidates will be admitted to the MRI program:

Cumulative college grade point average.

Grade point averages from all institutions attended will be calculated to determine a cumulative college GPA. The cumulative GPA will be weighed in determining admission to the MRI program. Please have all college transcripts sent to:

ACT or SAT composite score OR college degree

Any student who does not have a college degree will need to submit ACT or SAT scores in order to be considered for the MRI program. Official score sheets may be submitted with the application packet, or directly to the Registrar's Office (address listed above). ACT or SAT scores printed on an official high school transcript will be accepted.

Specific college courses with a "C" (2.0) or above:

- a. Biology 201 (Human Anatomy)
- b. Biology 202 (Human Physiology)
- c. Communications 101 (Interpersonal Communications)
- d. Creativity Elective (2011-2012 catalog, pg. 51 & 52)
- e. EMT 110 (Medical First Responder Training)
- f. English 151 (Freshman Composition)
- g. Mathematics 121 (Intermediate Algebra)
- h. Office Information Technology 227 (Medical Terminology)
- i. Physics 109 (Introduction to MRI Physics) or RADI 121 (Radiologic Physics)
- j. Psychology 201 (Introduction to Psychology)
- k. Sociology 201 (Introduction to Sociology)

All applicants meeting the above criteria are eligible to be considered for the MRI program.*

*Applicants who are Technologists and have completed an accredited program and are registered by the American Registry of Radiologic Technology (ARRT) in Radiography, Radiation Therapy, Nuclear Medicine (registrations through NMTCB is also accepted) or Sonography (registration through ARDMS is also accepted) will need to submit official transcripts and proof of registration, and are strongly encouraged to schedule an appointment with an academic advisor to determine admission requirements.

2012-2013 Understanding the MRI Point Sheet

The MRI Point Sheet is used to rank students for selective admission into the Magnetic Resonance Imaging program. Only those who have met all of the admission requirements, and who have submitted a MRI Application Packet by the program deadline date, will be included in this ranking and selection process. (Please refer to page 1 of this packet for program deadline dates.)

Each applicant will be ranked on SECTIONS A, B, C, and D

SECTION A:

1. The CALCULATED COLLEGE GPA is used to determine the amount of points awarded to applicants, with a maximum of 25 points. Your calculated college GPA is determined by adding the GPA points earned from EACH college, then adding the GPA hours (or credit hours) from EACH college, and then dividing the total points by the total hours.

NOTE: No points are awarded for a calculated GPA below 2.4.

SECTION B:

1. Applicants are awarded points to match the ACT COMPOSITE SCORE, with a maximum of 25 points. A composite score of 13 – 25 will earn points equal to the composite score. A composite score of 26 – 36 will earn 25 points.

NOTE: No points are awarded for an ACT composite score of 12 or below.

If you have an associate degree or higher (from an accredited institution, with a 2.5 GPA or above), and did not submit ACT scores, use COLLEGE DEGREE – item #2 below.

2. A COLLEGE DEGREE from an accredited institution will earn points in lieu of the ACT COMPOSITE SCORE, as long as your GPA from that institution is a 2.5 or above. Points are given for an associate, a bachelor's, or a master's degree.

NOTE: If your GPA is below a 2.5 at the institution from which your degree was earned, no points will be awarded for the degree.

If you do not have a degree from an accredited institution, use ACT COMPOSITE SCORE – item #1 above.

For SECTION B, points are awarded for either ACT COMPOSITE SCORE or COLLEGE DEGREE – not both; however, if you submit documentation for both ACT and a DEGREE, we will calculate points using whichever earns the most points.

SECTION C:

GENERAL EDUCATION COURSES: Points are awarded for the specific courses listed. These courses must have been taken at KCC, or transferred to KCC from another college. A grade of C or higher in the 4 general education courses earns 1 point each, with a maximum of 4 points in this section.

SECTION D:

PROGRAM SPECIFIC COURSES: For each course, a grade of A or A- earns 4 points; a B+, B or B- earns 3 points; and a C+ or C earns 2 points. **A grade of C- or below does not earn points, will not count toward admission or graduation requirements, and will not be accepted.**

+2 POINTS: Two additional points will only be given to applicants who applied to the same program, consecutively, and within the last 3 years, but were not offered a seat in the program. (Maximum: 2 points.)

This guide is information only. Final point totals are calculated by the Admissions office using official documents. Please keep in mind that point totals change each year based on the applicant pool and Admission requirements.
