

Joint Admission Program

Kellogg Community College and Western Michigan University are teaming together to provide students with another path to a bachelor's degree in Aviation Flight Science, Aviation Maintenance Technology, and Aviation Science and Administration. This unique arrangement features admission to both institutions and it provides students with a personalized program plan to follow while attending classes at both KCC and WMU over the course of their degree programs.

This joint admissions program differs from a conventional transfer program by allowing participating students to take advantage of academic support and facilities at both institutions for the duration of their program.

Benefits to the Student

- There is a significant cost savings for the student by taking some courses at Kellogg Community College.
- A personalized program plan developed by an academic advisor at each institution will ensure that the student only takes courses he or she needs to graduate.
- The transfer process is eliminated. Courses listed on the student's personalized program plan will automatically flow from one institution to the other.
- The student will have full access to all KCC and WMU academic support, advising, computer labs, and student life activities.
- The ability to earn an aviation degree by taking courses part-or full-time.
- Upon program completion, the student will earn an associate's degree from KCC and a bachelor's degree from WMU.

Eligibility

Any student interested in a career in Aviation Flight Science, Aviation Maintenance Technology, or Aviation Science and Administration is eligible if they meet the admission requirements of both KCC and WMU.



The Process to Enroll in this Program

1. Explore WMU Aviation Flight Science, Aviation Maintenance Technology, and Aviation Science and Administration programs and careers.
2. Apply to both KCC and WMU.
3. Complete the financial aid process at KCC.
4. Meet with academic advisors at both KCC and WMU to create a personalized program plan.
5. Begin taking classes.



Program Admission and Advising

In order to participate, students must apply to both institutions and must be admitted to each. While this admission process may be started at any time, students are encouraged to apply to both institutions as early as possible.

After admission, students will meet with an assigned academic advisor at each institution to develop a Personal Program Plan (PPP) which outlines the entire sequence of courses.

Financial Aid

Students participating in this program need to complete the financial aid processes required at both KCC and WMU. It is important to note that while this program's participants may be enrolled in classes at both institutions simultaneously, financial aid can only be distributed by one institution at a time. As a result, when a student is taking most of their courses at Kellogg Community College, KCC will be considered the home institution and financial aid will only be distributed through KCC. As the student progresses to taking the majority of their courses at WMU, the financial aid will be distributed through WMU.
