## Kellogg Community College Accounting, B.S.

The College of Business is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB). It is one of 549 business programs worldwide and one of about 41 undergraduate only programs to have this prestigious accreditation. This accreditation assures students that our programs meet rigorous and continuous standards of high quality, which sets our graduates apart.

For the student whose career objective is a professional degree in Business, NMU's College of Business offers majors in Accounting, Accounting/Corporate Finance, Accounting/CIS, Accounting/Financial Planning, Business/Computer Information Systems (with a choice of a concentration in End User Training, Web Development, and Networking Administration), Entrepreneurship, Finance, Management, Marketing, and Personal Financial Planning.

In addition to the many degrees students can choose, NMU's College of Business offers them in a setting where faculty and students work together in an atmosphere of creative exploration. A Financial Trading Lab, Superior Fund (student managed investment fund), New Business Venture Competition, Greeting Card Project, are examples of first-class hands-on learning opportunities available to students which are comparable and even better than most institutions in the country. Moreover, students will find life-enriching opportunities in our many student clubs, internships at major companies, and travel/study to foreign countries.

College of Business majors cannot enroll in NMU business courses (300-level or above) until they have been admitted to the College of Business. To be considered for admission to the College of Business, students must complete pre-requisite courses equivalent to NMU's EN 111, EN 211, MA 103, MA 171, ACT 230, ACT 240, EC 201, EC 202, CIS 112 (except CIs majors), CIS 212, 8 credits of Liberal Studies Program courses, and other elective credits to total 48 semester credit hours with an overall 2.25 GPA. Current enrollment can count toward meeting the minimum requirements, however, formal admission will not be granted until after successful completion of the minimum credits. After receiving general admission to NMU, students must then submit a separate application to the College of Business by February 15 for the fall semester, October 1 for the winter semester, or March 1 for the summer semester.

**Accounting Major:** This major provides basic competency in the functional areas of accounting and provides students with the minimum requirements to sit for professional examinations such as the CPA and CMA examinations. This major prepares students for such career opportunities as certified public accountant (CPA), cost analyst, controller, financial analyst, senior accountant, and vice-president for finance and accounting. ### Other Graduation Requirements:

1. Students can fulfill NMU's **world cultures** requirement by completing one of the following while at Kellogg Community College: ANTH 200, HIST 260, LITE 205, or LITE 206
2. At least one course in the Liberal Studies Program must be at the **300-level or above**. This requirement can be completed before attending the university if the transfer student selects a course that transfers at that level. At Kellogg Community College, the following courses meet this requirement: ART 213, LITE 205, LITE 206, LITE 211, or LITE 212

*Note: A maximum of 64 semester credits and an additional 4 semester credits in physical education activity courses may transfer from a two-year community or junior college.*
