

# Northern Michigan University

## Kellogg Community College Special Education, B.S. (Elementary Education)

This bachelor's degree program qualifies graduates for an Elementary Provisional Certificate and an endorsement to teach children in Kindergarten through grades 12 in their specialty area as well as regular classrooms in grades K-5. Students will have a specialty area in cognitive impaired (CI) or emotionally impaired (EI).

Although not required, students may select a teaching minor (English, French, Geography, German, History, Integrated Science, Language Arts, Mathematics, Physical Education, Reading, Social Studies, or Spanish)).

For admissions requirements into the School of Education, students should refer to Teacher Selection and Retention Standards in the NMU Bulletin. Requirements include:

1. A cumulative GPA of 2.70 or higher in undergraduate-level college credits;
2. At least 24 credits in Liberal Studies courses outside of a student's major and minor with a GPA of 2.50 or higher;
3. A satisfactory score on the Pre-Professional Screening Test (PPST). The PPST is waived for students who have ACT sub-scores of 21 in English and reading and a sub-score of 20 in Mathematics or SAT scores of verbal 450 and mathematics 500;
4. A passing score on the Michigan Test for Teacher Certification (MTTC) Basic Skills tests; and
5. Successfully complete the pre-methods education courses (ED 201, ED 230, and ED 301), MA 150, and MA 151.

### Other Graduation Requirements:

1. Students can fulfill NMU's **world cultures** requirement by completing one of the following while at Kellogg Community College: ANTH 200, LITE 205, or LITE 206
2. At least one course in the Liberal Studies Program must be at the **300-level or above**. This requirement can be completed before attending the university if the transfer student selects a course that transfers at that level. At Kellogg Community College, the following courses meet this requirement: ART 213, LITE 205, LITE 206, LITE 211, or LITE 212

*Note: A maximum of 64 semester credits and an additional 4 semester credits in physical education activity courses may transfer from a two-year community or junior college.*
