Admission

Bachelor of Science in Nursing

Transfer Students

1. Complete the WMU application form indicating nursing as the intended major.
2. Request and complete the WMU Bronson School of Nursing application which is available two months prior to the deadlines of October 1 and March 1.
3. Consult with the Nursing Advisor as to equivalencies of prior coursework.

Criteria:

1. A minimum cumulative college grade point average of 2.8 on a 4.0 scale.
2. Writing Skills as demonstrated in response to questions on application.
3. Health-related work, community or volunteer experience.
4. Professional appearance of application.

Transfer student will be admitted to the College of Health and Human Services (PRPR) until the student is admitted to the pre-nursing curriculum. The sequence of courses can be individualized depending on the academic needs of the student. Admission to pre-nursing is competitive and on a space-available basis. **Admission to the pre-nursing curriculum will not guarantee admission to the professional nursing curriculum.** *Pre-nursing* students will apply to the professional nursing curriculum during enrollment in NUR 1020.
