Take one of the following: PEC 121, or 150 through 160.	
<i>Group III. Social Science Group Requirement</i> .....	8
Take one of the following: POSC 200, 201, 202; SOCI 201; or HIST 104.	
Take one course from the following: ANTH 200; ECON 201, 202; HIST 103, 106, 201, 202, 203, 210; SOCI 202, 203, 204.	
Take one course from the following: HIST 151, 151H, 152, 152H	
<i>Group IV. Science and Mathematics Group Requirement</i> .....	8
Take SCIE 100 or 103.	
Take one of the following: (selection must include a laboratory if not taken above):	
ASTR 104; BIOL 101, 110, 111, 112; CHEM 100, 110; GEOG 100; PHYS 111, 201.	
<i>Group V. Humanities Group Requirement</i> .....	8
Take three courses from the following: ART 211, 212, 213; HUMA 150; LITE 105, 216; MUSI 211; THEA 121 or 122.	

Completion of course requirements in Groups I, III, IV and V satisfies the MACRAO Agreement between KCC and Western Michigan University.

*Take all of the following:*

MATH	Quantitative Reasoning Take one of the following if you do not select math as a major or minor: MATH 111, 122, 124, 128, 130, 135, 140 or 141.	3-4

NOTE: This guide in combination with one that reflects your teaching major may allow you to satisfy the requirements for an Associate Degree at KCC, please see an Academic Advisor.

NOTE; Students beginning classes for the first time at KCC in the Fall semester of 2004 will need to complete COMM 101 to satisfy KCC graduation requirements for all Associate degrees. Please consider this requirement when selecting your elective options for your transfer program.

All students seeking admission to teacher education curricula as entering freshmen, transfers, or as students changing curricula must contact the Office of Admissions and Advising. All students declaring a preference for a curriculum leading to a teaching certificate will be assigned a pre-education designator at the time of admission to the University.

Students wishing to enter the **Elementary Education** or **Secondary Education** program must meet the following **minimum requirements at the time of application**:

- Completion of at least 35 credit hours
- Completion of all Western Michigan University Intellectual Skills Development courses if required (e.g. MATH 1090, LS 1040, ENGL 1000)
- Completion of an approved college level writing course
- Completion with a grade of "C" or better ED 2500 Human Development (for Elementary and K-12 programs) or ED 2000 Introduction to American Education (for Secondary 6-12 programs)
- Achievement of a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 or better
- Achievement of passing scores on the Michigan Test for Teacher Certification (MTTC) - Basic Skills Section
- Once all of the above requirements have been met, a formal application requesting admission to the program must be submitted to the Office of Admissions and Advising, 2504 Sangren Hall.

### **Certificates**

#### **Michigan Teaching Certificates, Validity Level**

There are two basic levels of Michigan teaching certificates currently available:

1. **Elementary** certificates issued after September 1, 1988 have the following validity: Kindergarten through fifth grade all subjects; kindergarten through eighth grade all subjects in a self-contained classroom; and sixth to, and including, eighth grade in the teachable major(s) and/or minor(s) for which a subject area test has been passed.
2. **Secondary** certificates issued after September 1, 1988 have the following validity: Sixth through twelfth grade in teachable major(s) and minor(s).
