<b>Group III. Social Science Group Requirement</b> .....	8
Take PSYC 201.	
Take HIST 103, 104, or POSC 201.	
Take HIST 201 or 202.	
<b>Group IV. Science and Mathematics Group Requirement</b> .....	8
Take one course from the following: SCIE 103 or BIOL 101 or BIOL 110 or BIOL 202..	
Take one course from the following: ASTR 104, BIOL 140, CHEM 100 or CHEM 110*	
<b>Group V. Humanities Group Requirement</b> .....	8
Take THEA 121 or 122.	
Take two courses from the following: ART 211, 212, 213, HUMA 150, 150H, LITE 105, 205, 206, 211, 212, 213, 222, 223, 285; MUSI 211.	

Completion of course requirements in Groups I, III, IV and V satisfies the MACRAO Agreement between KCC and Western Michigan University.

NOTE: Students beginning classes for the first time at KCC in the Fall semester of 2004 will need to complete COMM 101 to satisfy KCC graduation requirements for all Associate degrees. Please consider this requirement when selecting your elective options for your transfer program.

All students seeking admission to teacher education curricula as entering freshmen, transfers, or as students changing curricula must contact the Office of Admissions and Advising. All students declaring a preference for a curriculum leading to a teaching certificate will be assigned a pre-education designator at the time of admission to the University.

Students wishing to enter the **Special Education** program must meet the following minimum requirements at the time of application for consideration-admission is not guaranteed:

- Completion of 56 hours (Spring semester hours may be counted)
- Completion of all Western Michigan University Intellectual Skills Development courses if required (e.g., MATH 1090, LS 1040, ENGL 1000)
- Completion of an approved college level writing course
- Completion of ED 2500 Human Development or an approved course, with a grade of "C" or better
- Achievement of a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 or better
- Achievement of passing scores on the Michigan Test for Teacher Certification (MTTC) - Basic Skills Section
- Documentation of thirty clock hours of experience with person(s) with a disability and a current T.B. test.
- Completion of a formal application for admission to Special Education by *February 1*.  
**Admission applications will be processed once a year.**
- May require a background check.
