

Art 225 Online Photo Gallery Assignment

To coincide & compound upon the Daybook Diary writing assignment you will create an online photography gallery, this resource must contain all edited photographs created for this course (a minimum of 100 pictures). It is to be highly structured and organized to such a degree that everything contained is chronological, labeled, and easily accessible via collections, sets, or tags.

Online Photo Gallery or **Photo Sharing** is the publishing of a user's digital photos online, enabling the user to disseminate them to others. Users can upload their files and share them publicly or keep them password-protected. This functionality is provided through both websites such as [Mac Web Gallery](#), [Atpic](#), [Flickr](#), [Kodak EasyShare Gallery](#), [MijnAlbum](#), [Photobucket](#), [Phanfare](#), [Picasa](#), [Shutterfly](#), [SmugMug](#), [Snapfish](#), [Webshots](#), [Woophy](#), [photoshop.com/express](#), [Zoomr](#), or [Photoshop](#) and applications such as proprietary software or software such as Adobe Photoshop, [www.webresizer.com](#), or [www.irfanview.net/](#) that facilitate the upload and display of images. The term photo sharing is often loosely applied to the use of online networking sites that are setup and managed by individual users, including photoblogs and social networking websites such as Myspace or Facebook. These resources offer the ability to upload images for sharing however their intent differs from that of photo sharing resources. Photo sharing also differs from file hosting services, online file storage services, or online media centers whose intent is to specifically designed to host static content such as large files that are not web pages. These personal file storage services are aimed at private individuals, offering a sort of "network storage" for personal backup, file access, or file distribution.
