

Applications are accepted beginning August 1, 2017.

The deadline date to submit an application for the Advanced Placement program is January 15, 2018.

The following items on this application must be completed and submitted prior to applying.

SECTION 1

I have met these requirements (6-year requirement not applicable for Advanced Placement)

- Admission requirements completed with a grade of "C" or higher:
 - COMM 101** Interpersonal Communication, OR **COMM 111** Business and Technical Communications, OR **COMM 207** Public Speaking, OR equivalent
 - ENGL 151** Freshman Composition, or equivalent
 - PSYC 201** Introduction to Psychology, or equivalent
 - PSYC 220** Developmental Psychology, or equivalent
 - Admission requirements completed with a grade of "B-" or higher: *
 - ACCUPLACER® Elementary Algebra of 85 or higher, or PSAT/SAT Mathematics score of 25 or higher, or MATH 101, 102, or higher with a B- or higher.
 - BIOL 201** Human Anatomy, or equivalent
 - BIOL 202** Human Physiology, or equivalent

**Any student not meeting the "B-" or higher requirement may contact Academic Advising regarding the appeal process.*
 - 18 years of age at the start of nursing program.** (Clinical education partners may require students to be 18 years of age to participate in clinical learning experiences.)
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SECTION 2 (Required for ALL nursing applicants)

- Submit official transcripts from **ALL** colleges attended.
Official college transcripts must be submitted in a sealed envelope issued by the college attended.
 - Grade point average (GPA) of 2.0** or higher at each institution at for applicants with a current LPN license.
***Students with a GPA falling below the requirement in any college may request an appeal from Selective Admissions.*
 - List each college attended on the Selective Admission Application.
 - Current Michigan LPN licensure
 - Submit Nursing Advanced Placement Program Application Writing Assignment with program application (see reverse side)

Nursing Advanced Placement Program Application Writing Assignment

The purpose of this writing assignment is two-fold. It requires time for self-reflection related to the rigors of the program and how you plan to be successful in the program. It also provides a mechanism for KCC to evaluate your ability to follow detailed instructions, which is important in nursing and the Advanced Placement Program.

Please address each of the following questions thoroughly. Include your name at the top of the page. Use the following formatting; size 12 Times New Roman font, double-spaced and one inch margins.

1. Why do you wish to advance your nursing career from a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) to a Registered Nurse (RN)?

2. This is a very rigorous and time intensive program. The full-time program requires approximately 40-60 hours per week of class, clinical and study time. The part-time program requires approximately 20-30 hours per week of class, clinical, and study time.
