<p>EMT 110 Medical First Responder (required) 3 Credits</p> <p>EMT 110 must be taken as part of the academy training if you do not currently possess a State of Michigan Medical First Responder License or higher. EMT 110 can be taken before the start of the academy or during the first semester of the academy.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If taken before the academy, you must pass the class with at least an 80% (B), take and pass the National Registry, and obtain your State of Michigan Medical First Responder License. • If taken during the academy, you only need to pass the class with at least an 80% (B).
<p>CRJU 209 Radar Certification 2 Credits</p> <p>Radar Certification is offered during the Spring 2 semester. This is not a required academy course, but is highly recommended for you to complete it. Completing this course will include certification in Michigan Speed Measurement Enforcement.</p>
