

# 2022-2023 Dental Hygiene (DEHY) Admission Packet for Fall 2022 Program

Deadline — March 1, 2022  
*Applications available January 18*



The DEHY program is designed to prepare a competent dental hygienist within two years (five semesters) as a full-time student. Dental hygienists are oral health care professionals who provide educational, preventive, and therapeutic services in a variety of health care settings including private practices, school systems, hospitals, long-term care facilities, research centers, business and industry.

This is a competitive point-based admission process. Points are awarded for grades in coursework, ACT/SAT scores, degrees earned, and calculated GPA from **all** accredited colleges/universities attended.

All students **must** complete a KCC General Application and have met **all** admissions requirements prior to applying to the DEHY program.

  - *Any coursework taken after submitting the DEHY application, but prior to DEHY application deadline, will require an updated transcript reflecting recently completed coursework.*

## IMPORTANT NOTES:

- Future employers may require proof of high school or GED completion as an employment requirement.
- Meet early and often with an Academic Advisor after completing KCC's General Application and submitting college transcripts and ACT/SAT scores, but prior to submitting the DEHY application, to review course specific requirements and transfer equivalencies.
- Transfer transcripts should be on file and evaluated by KCC's Registrar's office before meeting with an Academic Advisor to get the most out of your appointment. Please note that it can take a maximum of two weeks for in-state transcripts and four weeks for out-of-state transcripts to be evaluated.
- Students accepted into the DEHY program are required to undergo a physical examination, immunizations, a drug screen, and criminal background check. Individuals may obtain a preliminary determination from the state of Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA) concerning whether any court judgments against him or her would likely result in a denial of a license.
